1.0 Purpose:

The Alamance County Emergency Management Office possesses and maintains several pieces of equipment that can aid in response to, mitigation of, and recovery from both emergency and non-emergency situations. Due to the storage location, limited personnel, and the timely needs for this equipment it is necessary to develop a systematic and routine method of deployment of these resources.

2.0 Policy

It is the policy of the Alamance Emergency Management Office to provide resources to county agencies and municipalities, to the extent possible, to assist with emergency and non-emergency situations.

3.0 Responsibility:

3.1 Emergency Management

The Alamance County Emergency Management Office is ultimately responsible for the deployment, operation, maintenance, and storage of the equipment listed in this document. If for some reason the Emergency Management staff is not available then the Fire Marshal's Office will assist in deploying the equipment.

3.2 Requesting Agency

All equipment should be considered resources by Alamance County Emergency Management and municipalities. It is the responsibility of the Incident Command to recognize the need for and request resources based on their situation and need.

4.0 Procedure

4.1 Request

1. As soon as the need for a resource is identified or, the need for a resource can be predicted with **planning** the Incident Command should make the request keeping in mind that it could take up to 1 – ½ hours before the resource will arrive.
2. The request should be made through Alamance County Central Communications (C-COMM), they can be contacted non-emergency as well at 336-570-6777).

3. C-COMM should then immediately contact the Emergency Management Staff on call and notify them of the request, location and nature of the incident, and the working channel for the incident.
4. C-COMM should obtain an Estimated Time of Arrival (ETA) from the responding staff.
5. C-COMM should notify the Incident Command of the responding staff and the ETA.
6. If the request is for a planned event the Emergency Management Office should be contacted at 336-570-4075 or 336-570-4080 at least two weeks prior to the event date when possible.

4.2 Response

1. Responding staff should respond accordingly.
2. After the resource is picked up attempt to contact Incident Command on the working channel, or C-COMM if Incident Command is unavailable, and update the ETA.
3. Staff shall respond to the scene with the necessary resource and provide operation of that resource during the incident.
4. If the incident is expected to extend through one operational period the Emergency Management Coordinator or their designee should be contacted to plan for additional personnel.

4.3 Return to Service

1. Immediately after the incident all equipment should be returned to a state of readiness. To include but not limited to fueling, cleaning, and restocking.
2. Any damage to equipment should be noted and repairs ordered as soon as possible.

Mobile Command-1 (MC-1)

Location: Alamance County EM Warehouse (108 Electric Avenue, Burlington, NC)

Requirements of Utilization: For planned and emergency incidents when the Incident Command system will be utilized for an extended period of time.

Normal response time and /or set up time: Response time during business hours (M-F, 8-5) will usually be around 45 minutes to 1 hour depending on the location of personnel. After normal working hours response time could vary from 1 to 2 hours. Set-up time when we arrive on scene typically takes about 15 minutes to be fully operational.

****A staff of Emergency Management will always stay with MC-1 when being used****

Capabilities: Able to run a small or large scale event with equipment that is listed below. The unit has an Onan generator that is capable of running for extended periods of time before refueling is required. There are 3 separate work stations available that have hardwired hookup to the internet along with power hookups. Flat screen monitor located on the front wall that has the abilities to provide information from any computer that is plugged into the hardwired system and from the external camera.

Normal response time and /or set up time: Response time during business hours (M-F, 8-5) will usually be under 45 minutes depending on the location of personnel and incident. After normal working hours response time could vary 45 minutes to 1.5 hours. Set-up time when we arrive on scene typically takes 15-20 minutes.

Capabilities: 150 kW Generator

Normal response time and /or set up time: Response time during business hours (M-F, 8-5) will usually be under 45 minutes depending on the location of personnel and incident. After normal working hours response time could vary 45 minutes to 1.5 hours. Set-up time when we arrive on scene typically takes less than five minutes.

Capabilities: Transport foam, absorbent, decon equipment (PPE, shower)

Normal response time and /or set up time: : Response time during business hours (M-F, 8-5) will usually be around 45 minutes to 1 hour depending on the location of personnel. After normal working hours response time could vary from 1 to 2 hours. Set-up time when we arrive on scene typically takes about 15 minutes to be fully operational.

Capabilities: Provided Climate Controlled workspace (heat and air) for command or rehab. CT-7 can also be utilized as a mobile conference room or place to provide meals.

BURLINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Burlington Fire Department is a fully staffed career department operating three shifts. Each shift consist of thirty two Firefighters covering six Stations strategically placed throughout the city. Each shift is commanded by two Battalion Chiefs with the city separated geographically by Battalion One which includes Stations; One, Two and Three and Battalion Two which includes Stations: Four, Five and Six.

Station one located at 215 South Church Street houses an Engine, a Ladder, a Heavy Rescue and Car One. Station One also houses the Mass Casualty Trailer, Car 3, several support vehicles, the Customer Service Trailer, CPS Trailer and Equipment Trailer. 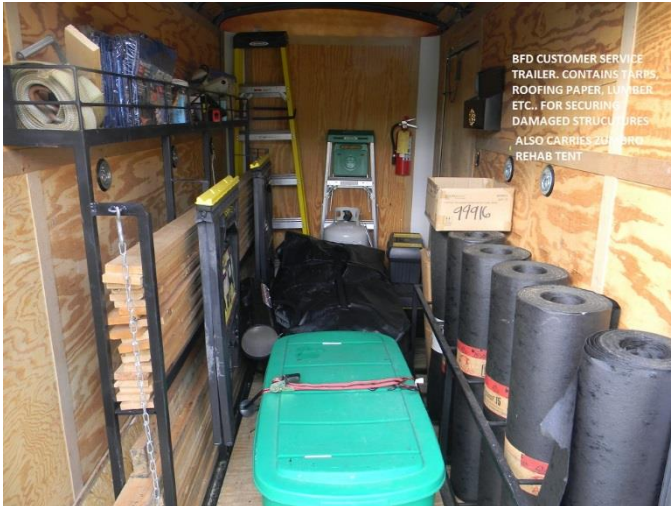

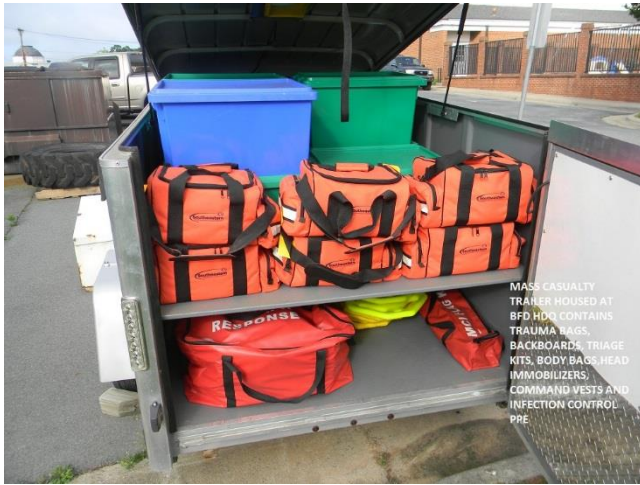

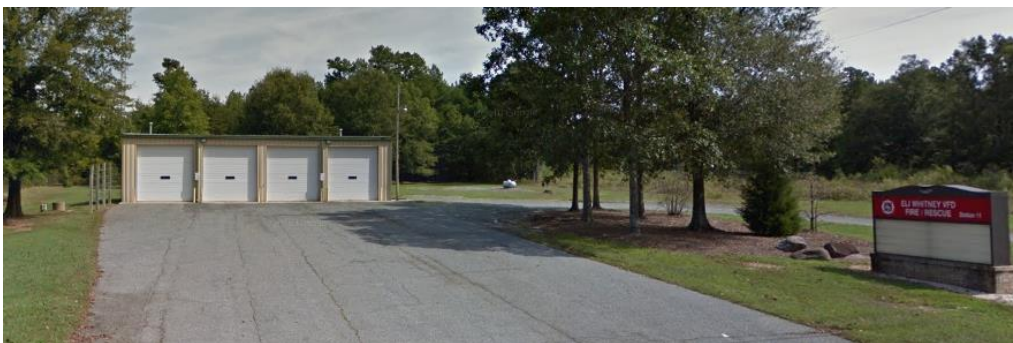

Alamance County Emergency Management Containment Pool Usage and Deployment Plan

Scope: ACEM recognizes the need for local fire departments to have some type of containment pool available on first arriving units to contain leaking fluids while awaiting arrival of additional resources to assist with spill control.

Purpose: ACEM wishes to provide each department with containment pools to have on the apparatus of their choice for spill mitigation.

Stocking: ACEM will provide departments that provide coverage to the Interstate with 4 pools per station. ACEM will provide the remaining departments with one pool. The Fire Chief or their designee will determine which unit or units these containment devices are stored on.

Use Criteria/Deployment: These pools should be used on ruptured saddle tanks and larger spills that can impact the environment. They are not being distributed to be used on small spills that are estimated to be less than 10 gallons. Small spills shall be handled in a conventional manner of damming and diking with absorbent or spill booms.

Re-stocking: Pools deployed on calls that ACEM responds to will be restocked on scene. When a department deploys a pool on a spill that Emergency Management does not respond to, the fire department needs to gather the following information and submit it to the Emergency Management office. We will use this information for reimbursement costs of the pool.
